

MR. R. W. HOYLAND., RAMPTON

With tragic suddenness the death occurred on Monday, Feb. 7th, of Mr. Robert William Hoyland, second son of Mr. and Mrs. James Hoyland, of Rampton. He was only just 21 years of age, and one of the very popular young men of the village. A keen sportsman and good cricketer, he was interested in all the other social functions.

About 18 months ago he had a serious accident and was an inmate of the Lincoln Hospital for a long time. He appeared to have fully recovered, but on Saturday, Feb. 5th, he was suddenly taken ill, rushed again to Lincoln Hospital, and died there late on Monday night.

The large attendance at the funeral on Thursday, Feb. 10th, and the crowded church testified to the deceased's popularity and to the esteem in which his family is held by a wide circle of friends.

The service was conducted by the Vicar (Canon Rushby Smith) and the Rev. W. Marshall, of Christ Church, Newark, with Mrs. Crawford at the organ.
